YOUR COUNCIL TAX EXPLAINED 2018/19

Funding reductions from central government since 2010 and increased pressure on services means we have to save £102m from our annual budget by 2020/21. Our net budget requirement for 2018/19 is £148.5m (after taking off £6.6m of core grants).

Between 2010/11 to 2018/19 the council delivered £83m through increasing efficiency, sharing services with other boroughs and reducing or finding other ways of delivering services. To save the remaining £19m we are going to have to change, reduce and stop more services. We continue to need your help, as a result we have relaunched the Sutton's Future consultation for 2018. You can have your say on how best we safeguard key services, play your part by telling us which services should be kept and how they should be run, by visiting www.sutton.gov.uk/suttonsfuture.

To help bridge the gap between the money we now receive from the Government (which will be £4.4m less in 2018/19 than in 2017/18) and how much our services

cost to run we have taken the decision to increase council tax. This is to contribute towards the increasing cost of adult social care, as a result of the growing numbers of elderly and frail people with increasingly complex needs. The Government has allowed councils, and we have agreed, an increase of council tax by 2% (£1.83m) specifically to help pay for adult social care which will cost a total of £53.9m in 2018/19. This equals a 48p per week increase to Band D Council Tax.

In addition, the council has decided to increase council tax for general purposes by 1.99% (£1.82m) in order to help us retain key services which have a significant impact on people's lives. This equals a 48p per week increase to Band D Council Tax.



From 2018/19, Sutton Council along with all London Boroughs has signed up to a London Business Rates Pilot Pool. Effectively, this Pilot Pool changes the way London Boroughs are funded. London Boroughs will no longer receive Revenue Support Grant. A "no detriment guarantee" has been included that ensures participating Boroughs could not be worse off collectively than before they entered the Pilot Pool.
