Sutton 2031 is the way you can help us shape the key planning policies for the borough.

There are three main elements to Sutton 2031:

- **The Local Plan Issues and Preferred Option Document** – the key principles for future development in the borough.
- **Draft Town Centre Masterplan** - the vision to boost the vibrancy and cultural offer of Sutton town centre and secure its future as a destination of choice.
- **Draft London Cancer Hub Development Framework** - the plans to create a world class campus that will establish Sutton as a centre of excellence for cancer research and treatment alongside a new school that will provide high quality careers and attract investment into Sutton.
