- (3) A notice under Sub-section (2) above shall specify the building to which it relates and the works of demolition intended to be carried out, and it is the duty of a person giving such notice to a Local Authority to send or give a copy of it to:
 - a) the occupier of any building adjacent to the building;
 - b) the British Gas Corporation; and
 - c) the Area Electricity Board in whose area the building is situated.
- (4) A person who Contravenes sub-sections (2) above is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 4 on the Standard Scale.

This notice should be sent to the Principal Building Control Officer, London Borough of Sutton, Environment, Housing and Neighbourhoods, Civic Offices, St Nicholas Way, Sutton, SM1 1EA **not less than six weeks** before the date on which the work is to commence.

A MESSAGE TO DEMOLITION CONTRACTORS FROM THE HEALTH AND SAFETY EXECUTIVE (HSE)

You have duties to secure the safety of yourself, your workers and the public during demolition work. HSE enforces health and safety law and can help you by providing you with advice and information.

The Construction Design and Management Regulations 2007

The Regulations set out what needs to be done by all parties to manage the work.

In brief, CDM requires:

The **client** to appoint a **CDM co-ordinator** and a **Principal Contractor** – this could be you.

The **CDM co-ordinator** and **Principal Contractor** to be competent.

A Construction Phase Plan to be drawn up *before* work starts.

Projects to be **notified** to the HSE by the **CDM co-ordinator** if they may last more than 30 days or involve more than 500 person days of work.

Controlling the risks:

You need to think about the risks to workers and the public *before* work starts. You should plan the work carefully to avoid putting anyone at risk. If risks cannot be avoided then all steps should be taken to minimise them.
