	ITEM	ACTION BY
1.	WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS	
	The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting and, in particular, the four prospective SACRE members, Mrs Uzma Mobin, Mrs Usma Hussein, Mr Lesley Kemp and Ms Rebecca Bishop.	
	The Clerk gave a brief introduction to SACRE, its aims and terms of reference and how the membership is made up.	
2.	APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE	
	Apologies had been received from Miss J Speck. Mr M Rao, Mrs M Horlock and Mr Leo Morrell were absent without apologies.	
3.	SACRE AGREED SYLLABUS CONFERENCE	
	PS-O explained the background to the locally agreed syllabus and that SACRE are required to review it every 5 years and advise the local authority that they have done so.	
	A major re-draft was done five years ago and so the only change proposed at the moment is the addition of some information on assessment. When the syllabus was originally reviewed there was a big change in assessment and no clear guidelines around how it should be carried out. However, members' views are invited on whether any other changes are required.	

	The document that has been circulated is in place of section 6 and should be of more help to schools.	
	AH commented that she thought it was very helpful and gives a clear picture of the things that are expected. RJ added that it is very good and shows clear differentiation around how pupils can progress.	
	SE asked why the page dividing the units of work up only mentions KS1 and KS2 and if there is a Secondary school equivalent. PS-O explained that Secondary schools have a different way of working and will have their own way of dividing up the units. The section on Assessment does cover all Key Stages up to KS4.	
	RB commented that it is difficult but that her school, which has a big uptake of RE, has been looking at the key skills required to support pupils through GCSE. There is skill based assessment as there is a big jump from KS3 to GCSE. RB added that her school does use KS1 and KS2 as a base line but that a lot of primary school teachers are not RE specialists.	
	RJ asked if it is useful for secondary schools to know what has been covered in year 6 so that it is not repeated. RB agreed and said that it was important to understand the syllabus and also how the units have been assessed.	
	CW asked about the document on the website which refers to KS1 and KS2. PS-O explained that there was a complete document covering all key stages but it appears that the website team haven't taken down the separate document.	
	Action: PG to ask the local authority web team to remove the old document.	PG
	RJ asked if it would be worth contacting the teachers to ask how they are finding the syllabus. PS-O confirmed that she had sought feedback soon after it was launched and subsequently talked to RE Co-ordinators at the regular meetings. More recently, after Easter, PS-O had mentioned that the syllabus was being reviewed and asked for any comments in a Newsletter sent to RE Co-ordinators.	
	Action: PS-O will email all RE Co-ordinators again with a deadline for comments.	PS-O
	Action: SACRE members are asked to pass any comments to PS-O by the end of August 2020 in order that she can bring a final version for approval to the next meeting.	PS-O

	<b>Wire Award</b> PS-O explained the WIRE Award to the new members. Seven schools have applied to complete it but, given the school closures, they had been permitted an extension to gather together their evidence.	
	<b>Websites</b> PS-O recapped the exercise that had taken place last Summer. Given the pressure that schools are currently under it was decided that a review of the websites will be carried out over the next few weeks and school's written to in the Autumn or Spring with SACRE's observations. SE offered to undertake this exercise.	
	MC asked if it is worth making contact with schools to let them know that SACRE are able to help if required. PS-O said that she had recently sent out a Newsletter to keep the profile high. There is also another NATRE update which PS-O will send on to RE Co-ordinators.
