Proposed parking changes for Anne Boleyn's Walk

We're writing to you as part of our ongoing review of parking in Sutton.

Parking remains one of the issues of most concern to residents in Sutton and we have received many requests for a review of parking arrangements across the borough.

Proposals for Anne Boleyn's Walk

We have received feedback about the need to reduce congestion at the junction with the A232, particularly at school drop-off/pick-up times. We are proposing to convert a small section of single yellow lines on both sides of Anne Boleyn's Walk to double yellow lines where the Red Route ends. **(see Map on the back of this letter).**

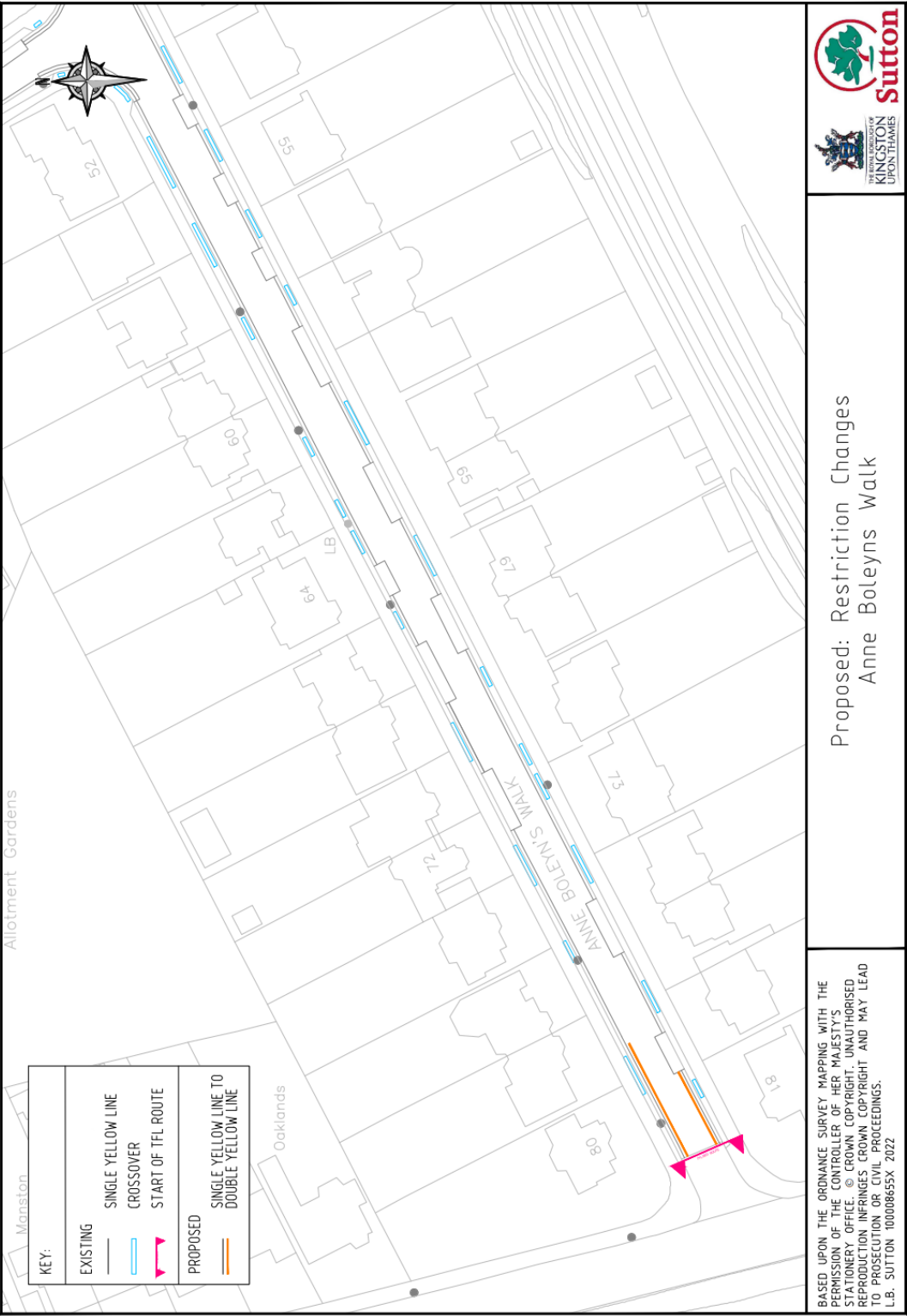
This informal stage of consultation will end on **4 October 2022**. We will review the feedback and speak with ward councillors before a decision is made whether to progress any formal proposals for changes.
