Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

If a premises licence is granted then I plan to use CCTV to monitor the inside and outside the premises. I will be training all staff on the sale of alcohol and will be supervising staff on a regular interval. I plan to adopt a Challenge 25 policy to serve customers and notices will be prominently displayed in the shop. Also, I plan to provide litterbins and lighting outside the premises for security. I will work with the local community to promote the licencing objective of Sutton Council and will work with the police to the best of my ability.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

A CCTV system will be in operation at the premises and recorded images shall be retained for a period of 31 days. CCTV footage will be provided to the police and other responsible authorities as soon as practicable and in any case within 48 hours of a request for such footage, subject of the provisions of the Data Protection Act.

A register of refusals of alcohol will be maintained at the premises. The register shall be examined on a regular bases by the duty manager / DPS and the date and time of each examination will be recorded in the register. The register will be made available for inspection by the police and other authorised officers of Sutton Council upon reasonable request.

c) Public safety

The Licence Holder is aware of their responsibilities in relation to current legislation.

An incident register will be maintained at the premises and will be made available to the authorities on request.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

A notice will be on display asking that the customers leave the area quietly and respect the local residents.

All staff at the store will be trained in how to manage any person who they suspect may create a public nuisance in the area of the premises. Such people will be asked to leave the area quietly (if safe to do so) and an entry will be made in the incident register.

e) The protection of children from harm

The premises will adopt a Challenge 25 policy. This means that if a customer purchasing alcohol appears to be under the age of 25 they will be asked for proof of their age to provide that are 18 years old or older.

Posters will be on display advising customers of the Challenger 25 policy in operation.

The only forms of identification that be accepted at the premises are passports, photo-card driving licences and cards bearing the 'PASS' hologram.

Staff will be trained in their responsibilities in making sales of alcohol under the Licensing Act 2003. Training will be documented and made available to the police and authorised officers of Sutton Council upon reasonable request.

 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that

 (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
