List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.

One Punch Drinks Ltd will operate a small-scale, made-to-order alcohol business from a private residential property with no public access. All alcohol will be compounded, bottled, stored securely, and dispatched directly to customers via recognised courier services.

To promote all four licensing objectives:

Prevention of crime and disorder: Alcohol will be securely stored in locked areas, and records of suppliers and customers will be maintained. The DPS, who holds a personal licence, will oversee all alcohol-related activity.

Public safety: All production and storage areas are contained within the premises, away from public access, with fire safety equipment in place. Alcohol will only be handled and packaged by trained staff.

Prevention of public nuisance: No customers will visit the premises. Deliveries will be made during reasonable hours to minimise disturbance. Noise and waste will be managed responsibly.

Protection of children from harm: Strict Challenge 25 age verification will be enforced on all orders and deliveries. Alcohol will never be sold to persons under 18. Couriers will also follow age verification procedures.

## b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Alcohol will be stored in a dedicated, locked area of the premises to prevent unauthorised access.

Comprehensive records will be kept of all suppliers and customers.

The DPS, who holds a valid personal licence, will oversee all alcohol-related activities and ensure compliance with licensing laws.

Only trained staff will handle alcohol production, bottling, and packaging.

Deliveries will be made via recognised courier services that follow age verification and secure handling procedures.

Any suspicious activity or attempted under age sales will be recorded and reported as appropriate.

## c) Public safety

All production, bottling, and storage of alcohol will take place within designated areas of the premises that are secure and away from public access.

Fire safety equipment, including smoke alarms and extinguishers, will be maintained in the premises.

All staff handling alcohol will be trained in safe handling procedures.

Deliveries will be packaged safely and dispatched via recognised courier services to minimise risk.

Premises will be kept clean and maintained to prevent accidents or hazards.

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

There will be no customers visiting the premises; all alcohol sales are made-to-order and delivered.

Deliveries will occur during reasonable hours to minimise noise and disruption to neighbours.

Packaging and dispatch activities will be managed to avoid any unnecessary noise or waste.

Waste from the business will be disposed of responsibly, in accordance with local regulations.

Operations are designed to have minimal impact on the surrounding residential area.

## e) The protection of children from harm

Strict Challenge 25 policy will be applied to all alcohol orders and deliveries.

Age verification will be carried out at the point of purchase online and by the courier upon delivery.

Alcohol will never be sold or supplied to anyone under the age of 18.

Only couriers with robust age-verification procedures will be used for deliveries.

There will be no access to the premises for children, and no adult entertainment, gambling, or other activities that could place children at risk.

#### NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or

• is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

## Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
  official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
  Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
  work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
  licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
  with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
  subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
  when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
  number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
  with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
  reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
  decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
  who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
  the UK including:-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
    - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
    - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
    - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
    - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

**Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities.** If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph:
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

## Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work">https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work</a>) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be checked online. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copy documents as set out above.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

## 1. General – All Four Licensing Objectives

One Punch Drinks Ltd is a small-scale, home-based business producing bespoke, made-to-order alcoholic beverages for delivery only. There will be no public access or on-site consumption. Alcohol will be compounded, bottled, and securely stored within a designated area of the premises (the kitchen), in accordance with health, safety, and licensing regulations.

The business will operate under the direct supervision of the DPS, who holds a valid personal licence. All alcohol will be sold and supplied to verified customers aged 18 or over, through controlled and traceable transactions. Robust procedures are in place to promote the four licensing objectives:

- Prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- Prevention of public nuisance
- Protection of children from harm

## 2. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- Alcohol and ingredients will be sourced only from legitimate, AWRS-registered suppliers.
- Alcohol will be stored securely in a locked area when not in use.
- The DPS will maintain full transaction records for all purchases and sales.
- All staff (if any are engaged) will receive training on age verification, refusal of sale, and responsible alcohol handling.
- CCTV is installed at the front of the premises for general security and deterrence
- Any suspicious activity or attempted underage purchase will be logged and reported to the relevant authorities.

# 3. Public Safety

- Production and bottling activities will take place in the kitchen area, which is fitted with smoke alarms.
- Equipment will be maintained in good condition and used according to safety guidance.
- No hazardous or flammable materials will be stored on-site beyond standard domestic quantities.
- Packaging and dispatch will follow safe handling procedures to minimise any risk to staff or couriers.
- The DPS will ensure compliance with all relevant food hygiene and health and safety standards.

## 4. The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- No customers or members of the public will visit the premises.
- All orders will be placed online and delivered via recognised courier services.
- Noise will be minimised by restricting production and dispatch operations to reasonable daytime hours.
- Waste materials (bottles, packaging, ingredients) will be disposed of responsibly through household or commercial waste channels.
- The premises will not produce odours or disturbances beyond normal domestic activity.

## 5. The Protection of Children from Harm

- A strict Challenge 25 policy will be applied to all sales.
- Age verification will occur at the point of order and again upon delivery, via couriers who operate a robust "Age Verified Delivery" process.
- Alcohol will never be sold or delivered to any person under 18 years of age.
- The business does not produce content, marketing, or labelling likely to appeal to minors.
- Any third-party staff or couriers will be made aware of age verification obligations.

# 6. Summary

This business operates as a low-risk, made-to-order drinks producer with no public interaction at the premises. It will be run by an experienced personal licence holder with strong knowledge of alcohol legislation and responsible retailing. All reasonable steps have been taken to ensure that the operation promotes the licensing objectives, prevents nuisance, and maintains compliance with the Licensing Act 2003.
