### LONDON BOROUGH OF SUTTON

- 1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the London Borough of Sutton propose to make the following Order The Sutton (Parking, Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. \*) Order 202\* under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 insofar as applicable and all other powers thereunto enabling as of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>1</sup>, as amended –
- 2. The general effect of the Order would be to introduce residents permit and visitor voucher parking bays operating Monday to Saturday between 8am and 6.30pm where vehicles in respect of which a valid permit (CH1) has been granted would be able to park in Park Lane, Cheam outside Nos. 5 to 15.

Properties that would be eligible for permits are Nos. 1 to 9 and 13 to 29 (odds only) **Park Lane**, Cheam.

#### NOTE

- The charges for residents permit holders parking places referred to in item 2 preceding are as follows:-
  - (a) the charge for **residents parking permits** depend on the permit group, set by the Council based on the CO<sub>2</sub> emissions of the vehicle for which the permit is issued (see the **Schedule** to this Notice) allocated to the vehicle for which the permit is issued, as set out in the following table -

Permit Group (see Schedule 1)	Standard Charge (per year)
1	£54
2	£70
3	£98
4	£130
5	£174

Additional residents permits may be issued at the standard charge shown above, plus a surcharge of £25 for a second permit and £50 for a third, in respect of a household. Where the  $CO_2$  emissions of a vehicle are not known due to the vehicle's age or similar, permit group 3 charges would apply. Wholly electric vehicles (EV's) will be exempt from any charge. A maximum of 3 resident's permits will be issued in respect of any household at any one time.

- (b) **residents visitors vouchers** are available free of charge to residents up to a maximum of 50 hours per household in any one year. Additional hours thereafter may be purchased at a charge of £69 per 100 hours.
- (c) **carer permits** for essential care visits are available at the following charges: (A) £42 per year for a resident care permit, which allows a carer to park in any permit holders parking place; or (B) £53 per year for each organisational permit, which allows an organisation to park in any permit holder's parking place for up to 3 hours maximum per day.
- (d) **child care permits** which allow a person providing child care to park in any permit holders parking place specific to the relevant permit parking area for which it is issued are available at a charge of £37 per year.
- (e) **Traders' permits** will provide those traders with a verified need for providing services to residents, undertaken in the resident's home, the facility to park in areas where there are resident permit parking controls for up to two hours are available at a charge of £234 per year.
- (f) There would be a £25 administrative charge for any alteration to a permit.

**Permit Groups for Alternative Fuel Vehicles:**

Note: These permit groups would be available for vehicle types L1 to L7 inclusive, (motorised vehicles less than 4 wheels including motorcycles) and M1 only (vehicles used for the carriage of passengers and comprising not more than eight seats in addition to the driver's seat), as defined by the DVLA vehicle type approval. For the avoidance of doubt this would not include vehicles designated by the DVLA as 'special purpose vehicles'.

Additional Permit Group - Goods vehicles not exceeding 3.5 tonnes (m.g.w.):

Note: This permit group would be available for vehicle type N1 (motor vehicles having at least 4 wheels which are designed and constructed for the carriage of goods and have a maximum gross weight not exceeding 3.5 tonnes) as defined by the DVLA vehicle type approval. For the avoidance of doubt any vehicle of vehicle type N1, such as light goods vehicles, will be classified as permit group 5 regardless of taxation class.

The Council of the London Borough of Sutton, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>1</sup>, as amended, and all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Order:-

## Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as **The Sutton (Parking, Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No.** \*\*) **Order 20**\*\* and shall come into force on \*\* \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* **20**\*\*.

### **Interpretation**

2. (1) In this Order:-

"Council" means the Council of the London Borough of Sutton;

"map-based schedule" means the map attached to and to be read in conjunction with this Order, which depicts the parking places designated by this Order, and in conjunction with the map schedule legend, identifies the type of each particular parking place and, if appropriate, certain of its governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map based schedule and where a parking place, loading place or length of waiting restrictions is depicted in the map based schedule, that parking place, loading place or length of waiting or loading restrictions will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data; and

"map schedule legend" means the map schedule legend presented with the map based schedule which, when used in conjunction with the map based schedule, the Articles of this Order.

"the Order of 2023" means **The Sutton (Parking, Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) Order 2023**<sup>2</sup>.

- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment; and
- (3) Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2023 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

## Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2023 thereto

- 3. (1) Each area on a street identified in the map based schedule by way of the map schedule legend as a parking place or a loading place and, where applicable, by way of the map schedule legend, as an area marked out and signed for the use therein of specified classes of vehicles following the conditions specified in the Order of 2023 in relation to that type of parking place, is designated as a parking place.
  - (2) Unless otherwise so identified, a parking place shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the carriageway and be an area marked either by a traffic sign or by another method of indicating the extent of a parking place as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016<sup>3</sup>.
  - (3) The provisions of the Order of 2023 (other than Articles 4 and 16) shall apply to an area designated as a parking place or loading place by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place or a loading place included a reference to an area designated as a parking place or a loading place by this Order.

## Waiting restrictions applicable to restricted streets

4. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2023 shall have effect as though any waiting restriction identified in a map based schedule and, where applicable, by way of the map schedule legend, and marked out and signed as a waiting restriction shall be construed as through it were a restricted street referred to in the Order of 2023.

### Placing of traffic signs, etc

5. The Council shall:

- (a) place and maintain traffic signs or other appropriate markings on the surface of the street indicating the limits of each parking place and each loading place designated by this Order; and
- (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of a parking place or a loading place.

## Amendments to the Order of 2023

- 6. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2023 shall have effect as though:
  - (a) is hereby varied as identified in the map-based schedule to this Order;
  - (b) there was added to Article 3 under 'Controlled Parking Zone' Part V Park Lane, Cheam Controlled Parking Zone (CH1)
  - (c) there was added Part XXI to Schedule 2 to that Order the table and headings to that table set out in the Schedule to this Order.


