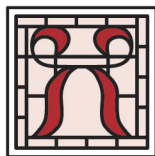

Dickinson (1874-1961), artist, designer and craftsman, who built his house between 1902-04 in the English Arts and Crafts style, following the teachings and philosophies of William Morris and John Ruskin. Inside the Grade II listed interior are his hand-made furniture, paintings, interior decoration, carvings and metalwork, which still inspire visitors today.

With very limited financial resources Dickinson built the house and its furniture himself – the ultimate in D.I.Y.!

Built around 1500, Whitehall Historic House is being given a new lease of life thanks to a grant of £1.5m from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF).

The grant means vital repairs to the building can be carried out and a programme of activities will be launched to encourage more people to use the museum and learn about their heritage.

Repair work to the building will involve tackling a damp problem and removing some intrusive 20th century fixtures while other original features are restored. Work will also be carried out to improve access and visitor facilities. New exhibitions will be installed showing what life has been like locally since earliest times.

Closed from Sunday 10th April 2016 for HLF funded repairs and renovations, Whitehall will re-open in the summer of 2017 with a new public programme, exhibitions and displays.

History for Infants (Key stage 1)

What was life like in the past?
 Through hands on learning and lively discussion, children are encouraged to contrast how we live today with life in the past to gain an understanding of what we mean by history. Discover what homes were like a long time ago, find out how and why toys were different to today, try on Tudor and Victorian clothes and take part in role play, handle replica domestic objects and compare your home with homes of the past.

Tudor Experience (Key stage 2)

Find out about what life was like in Tudor England.

How did it differ if you were rich or poor? Explore the Tudors, including key figures such as Henry VIII, compare the differences between town and countryside and focus on the daily life of the Tudors (covering topics such as costume, food, medicine, housing and entertainment). As well as dressing up, children handle a range of period objects and study primary sources to gain a comprehensive understanding of this period.

Victorian Experience (Key stage 2)

Learn about life in Victorian times - how was it different from today?

What were toys, domestic appliances, inventions and jobs like during the 1800s? Find out about key Victorian figures, such as Queen Victoria, as well as local Victorian residents at Whitehall by handling objects and discussing subjects such as work, play and home life. Dressing up and role play, as well as lively discussion, are key components of the session.

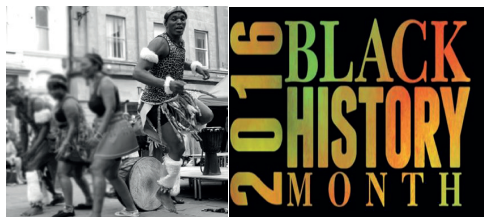

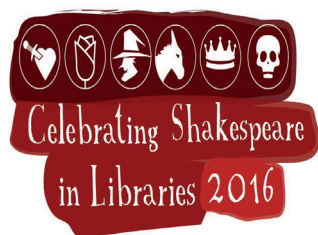

The Past on Glass Project

The Past on Glass is transforming. In July this year the Heritage Lottery Fund awarded Sutton Archives a further grant which will see the completion of our project to rehouse, digitise, catalogue and research the glass plate negatives. The new project is entitled “Ordinary Lives, Extraordinary Times: Rediscovering the Female Portraits of David Knights-Whittome, Photographer, 1904-1918”. The grant will enable us to research the history of the Edwardian women featured in the collection and work with a local writers group, women’s centres and schools.

David Knights-Whittome was a local photographer who had many customers living in Sutton but also further afield. He became known as “Photographer to the King” because he photographed King Edward VII, his son George V and the future Edward VIII. The collection of glass plate negatives was discovered in the basement of 18 High Street, Sutton in 1978 and transferred to Sutton Library’s Archives Section for storage but it is only in the last five years. The two HLF grants are enabling us to preserve the collection for future generations.
